

EU, EEA and Swiss Confederation Citizens

The University of Oradea comprises 15 faculties providing undergraduate and postgraduate studies in Romanian and in English. Courses offered in English are for the following specialisations:

1. Undergraduate level:

- a. BA in International Relations and European Studies (3 years) at the Faculty of History, International Relations, Political and Communication Sciences
- b. BA in Tourism Geography (3 years) at the Faculty of Geography, Tourism and Sport
- c. BA in Kinesiotherapy and Special Motricity (3 years) at the Faculty of Geography, Tourism and Sport
- d. BM in Medicine (6 years) at the Faculty of Medicine and Pharmacy
- e. BA in International Business (3 years) at the Faculty of Economics
- f. BA in Business Administration (3 years) at the Faculty of Economics
- g. BA in Medical Physics (3 years) at the Faculty of Sciences
- h. BA in Robotics (4 years) at the Faculty of Management and Technological Engineering

2. Postgraduate level:

- a. MA in European Studies (2 years) at the Faculty of History, International Relations, Political and Communication Sciences
- b. MSc in Advanced Mechatronics Systems (2 years) at the Faculty of Engineering and Technology Management
- c. MA in Tourism, Management and Planning (2 years) at the Faculty of Geography, Tourism and Sport.
- d. MA in Business Administration (2 years) at the Faculty of Economics
- e. MA in International Business Administration (2 years) at the Faculty of Economics
- f. MA in Advanced Management (2 years) at the Faculty of Economics

Language of studies

a. Romanian

Candidates who do not speak Romanian can apply for studies in Romanian provided they take a preparatory language course one year before enrolment. At the end of the preparatory year, the candidates will acquire a *Romanian language certificate*. In case the candidate already has knowledge of Romanian language, *they can take the Romanian language test at the Faculty of Letters and get a language certificate*. Romanian language certificates will be accepted only from the Romanian Language Institute or Romanian universities accredited to issue such certificates.

The Romanian language test fee is **300 RON**

b. English

Candidates choosing *specialisations taught in English will have to pass an interview before the entrance exam* depending on the faculty chosen by the candidate.

Dates for the language exams for the July session will be settled and announced on time.

3. Available places

Every year, the Senate of the university with the approval of the Ministry of National Education decides on the number of available places. The number of available places is published on the university's webpage.

Admission process:

The University of Oradea has implemented the Bologna system since 2005. Usually, there are two admission sessions: in July and in September.

1. Eligible candidates for places available for EU, EEA and the Swiss Confederation

-Candidates from the European Union, the European Economic Area and the Swiss Confederation

-Candidates who have graduated from a high-school or college accredited in their country and acknowledged by the Romanian Ministry of National Education.

The admission for EU, EEA and Swiss Confederation candidates has 2 stages:

1. Obtaining the recognition of previous studies from the Ministry of National Education (Certificate issued by the National Centre for the Recognition and Equivalence of Diplomas).
2. Participation of the candidates to the admission organised by the University of Oradea.

1st stage

Applying for the acknowledgement of studies (Certificate issued by the National Centre for the Recognition and Equivalence of Diplomas)

According to Law 316/2006, all the citizens of EU, SEE and the Swiss Confederation have access to all forms of education in the same conditions as Romanians including tuition fees.

As of 15.06.2009, all citizens of the abovementioned countries do no longer need an acceptance letter, but a CERTIFICATE issued by the National Centre for the Recognition and Equivalence of Diplomas at the Romanian Ministry of National Education. Once they acquire the certificate, the candidates can register for admission at the University of Oradea.

Candidates who have graduated in Romania do not need an approval from the Ministry of Education.

The application file for the acknowledgement of studies must be submitted to the International Relations Department/Office for Foreign Students at the University of Oradea. Files submitted by individual candidates are not processed by the Ministry of Education.

FILE PROCESSING

The deadline for the submission of files at the Foreign Students Office, International Relations Department, in order to obtain the Certificate of Recognition of Studies are as follows:

- **12.00 o'clock on the 21th of June 2019 for the July admission session;**
- **12.00 o'clock on the 8th of August 2019 for the September admission session.**

Before the file is processed, all candidates must pay a non-refundable processing file fee of 150 euro, a fee requested by the University of Oradea. The processing file fee will be paid to the University's bank account before the application is submitted and it covers the expenses for the issuance of the certificate. Once the processing file fee is paid, it cannot be reimbursed.

The documents required for the application are as follows:

1. Application form for the University of Oradea (click [HERE](#) to download)
2. Application form for recognition of studies (click [HERE](#) to download)
3. High-school Diploma (original language) – (2 copies)– simple copy, if the diploma is issued in English/ French/ Spanish/ Italian and , the legalized copy of the translation of this Diploma, into Romanian (if it was issued in other language, than those mentioned above);
4. Transcript of Records from High School (for all years) – (2 copies)– simple copy, if the document is issued in Romanian/ English/ French/ Spanish/ Italian and, the legalized copy of the translation of this document, into Romanian (if it was issued in other language, than those mentioned above);
5. Identification document (photocopy): Passport pages 1,2,3,4 or national ID.
6. Confirmation of payment of the non-refundable processing file fee of 150 euro

7. Extra documents:

- For diplomas from **UK** we require *full A Level diploma with subjects in Sciences, Biology, Chemistry, Physics.*
- For Bacalaureat Diploma obtained in **Spain** - "*Pruebas de Aptitud para el Acceso a la Universidad, calificación Apto.* .
- For diplomas obtained in **Sweden** please attach **Conditional Statement of Eligibility issued by the National Admissions Office to Higher Education** (VHS - Verket for Hogskolesrvice) - *regarding the access to higher education*
- For diplomas from **Greece** - Panellinies Exetaseis (The paper from the national exams for the general high school). **The translations which are made in Greece, will be legalized/notarized by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs in Greece.**
- For diplomas from **Portugal** - Exames Nacionais do Ensino Secundario
- For diplomas from **USA** – Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT) or ACT.

8. If the submission of the file will be made by another person, the authorized person must submit to the Foreign Students Office a notarized power of attorney and passport copy.

Each document written above, must be translated into Romanian language **and** legalized by a public notary, if it is not issued in: **English/French/Spanish/Italian**

- **For countries like Greece, Spain, Italy, Portugal and Cyprus the copy of the school diploma must be attested with the Apostille of Hague Convention!**
- **For the other countries which are not from EU, legalized copies are of the translation into Romanian are compulsory! Simple copies of the diplomas will not be accepted!**
- **Diplomas obtained in countries that are not part of Haga Convention must be legalized by: the Ministry of Education, Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the country of the issuance of the diploma and the Romanian Embassy/Consulate of the country of the issuance of the diploma;**

For the countries where there is no Romanian Embassy/Consulate or those countries which have no Embassy/Consulate in Romania, the study documents will be stamped by the Ministry of Education and the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the country of issuance of the documents;

All candidates must submit their files at the Foreign Students Office, International Relations Department before the deadlines mentioned above.

If a candidate is considered eligible and the file is complete, the International Relations Department forwards the documents to the Ministry of National Education to issue the Certificate according to which the candidate can pursue their studies in Romania.

The Certificate of Recognition of Studies has to be submitted along with the additional required documents upon registration for the admission at the chosen faculty.

It is important to know is that the admission can be done strictly through the university and you do not need any agents to help you with the paperwork. The university will take care of your acceptance letter, admission and everything. The website <http://www.oradeauniversity.com/> is not an official website and has nothing to do with our university. Therefore, we will not take any responsibilities for documents sent to this contact!

Very important!

1. Upon arrival at the University of Oradea, in order to do the registration with the chosen faculty, the students shall submit the original documents.
2. The students can be enrolled at the University of Oradea on condition that they obtain the certificate from the Ministry of National Education and have passed the admission criteria for the faculty and specialisation of their choice.

***nd* 2 stage**

Registration at the university

Registration of the candidates for the admission exam or file competition is done on the basis of the acknowledgement of studies issued by the Ministry of National Education together with the original file that must be submitted in the legal admission periods. The registration file must comprise the documents according to the admission methodology at the University of Oradea.

The admission period and the dates for registration at the Faculty of Medicine and Pharmacy (University of Oradea) will be from the 10th to the 25th July 2019.

The admission exams will take place in the 26th July-27th July

The registration will be at the secretariat of the Faculty of Medicine and Pharmacy, University of Oradea, Piața 1 Decembrie nr.10, Oradea, phone: +40 259 412 834, +40 259 411 454, fax: +40 259 418 266, e-mail: fmf@uoradea.ro

The specific documents to be submitted are as follows:

- 1. High school diploma or equivalent to the original and certified translation into Romanian;**
- 2. The original of the Transcript of Records and the certified translation into Romanian;**

3. **Statement issued by the Ministry of National Education which proves that the student has the right to study in Romania (this certificate is issued by the Ministry of Education, based on the file submitted for review); ATESTAT**
4. **Copy of birth certificate and certified translation into Romanian;**
5. **Copy of passport or identity card;**
6. **Registration fee paid at the Faculty of medicine and pharmacy;**
7. **Marriage certificate (if the student's name changed after marriage);**
8. **Medical certificate;**
9. **4 passport photos;**
10. **A paper folder.**

Fees

Registration fees for the academic year 2019-2020 are as follows:

- ***the fee for registration - 150 RON (aprox. 30 Euro)***
- ***the fee for appeals - 150 RON (aprox. 30 Euro)***
- ***the enrolment fee - 100 RON (aprox. 25 Euro)***

Visa

EU, EEA and Swiss Confederation citizens do not need a visa for studies but they have the duty to inform the Romanian Immigration Office/Bihor Immigration Office on their stay in Oradea (Oficiul Român pentru Imigrări /Serviciul pentru Imigrări Bihor).
